Situation Report No. 10
Earthquake in Peru
12:00 hours

August 24-2007

Situation

1. At 11:40:58 PM UTC/GMT (Greenwich time) 6:34:56 PM local time on August 15th, an earthquake measuring 7.9 degrees in the Richter scale struck in the Department of Ica. The epicenter was 25 miles (61 kilometers) west-northwest of Chincha Alta, Peru, and 90 miles (161 kilometers) south-southeast of Lima, according to the U.S. Geological Survey. The epicenter was 30.2 km depth (18.8 miles). The effects were also strongly felt in Lima capital.
2. The last official report issued by the National Institute of Civil Defense (INDECI) informed the situation up to August 24th, 05:00 hrs:
514 dead
1,090 wounded
39,741 houses destroyed according to Peruvian Government preliminary assessments.
12,781 houses affected.
90 hospitals affected.
14 hospitals destroyed according to Peruvian Government preliminary assessments.

National Response

1. Civil Defense Committee of the Province of Yauyos, received 12.5 tons of humanitarian aid from the Civil Defense Regional Direction of Junin and the Ministry of Production. Additionally, Municipality of Huaura (Lima) donated 15 tons of humanitarian aid.
2. In Region Lima, several points have been identified in order to established shelters in Laraos (4), Tupe (5), Tomas (2) and Alis (2).
3. The Operations Emergency Centre of the Province of Chincha (COEP) informed the start of humanitarian aid distribution in the shelters of Simón Bolívar (Sunampe), José Olaya sector, Grau and Dos de Mayo. EDAN of districts of Sumanpe, Grocio Prado, Tambo de Mora, El Carmen, Alto Lorán and Chincha Baja has been verified.
4. The COEP Chincha set a meeting with international cooperation authorities, Red Cross representatives, Ministry of Economy, DIGESA (General Direction of Sanitation), United Nations, Ministry of Health, district mayors, among other

authorities; in order to coordinate the damage assessment and humanitarian aid delivery.

5. Government plans to earmark 260 millions of soles (US\$ 82.28) for the Fund for Integral Recovery of Areas Affected by the Earthquake (Forsur) before the end of the year. President García that the Forsur will lead the reconstruction process in coordination with ministers, regional presidents and local authorities.
6. Ministry of Education will initiate the setup of prefabricated classrooms in Pisco.
7. The Ministry of Housing informed that 14 public and private institutions are working on rubble removal in the district of San Andrés, province of Pisco.
8. Following instructions from President of Peru, the Peruvian Army will expand its deployment to assist more areas affected by the earthquake, to include Castrovirreyna and Huaytará provinces in Huancavelica region. The armed forces are already delivering aid to these areas, as well as the province of Yauyos in Lima department. Commander-in-Chief of the Army said that currently about 1800 soldiers are helping with security and debris removal.
9. On August 24th, the Congress of the Republic passed a law that modifies current Customs Law and simplifies administrative procedures to dispatch shipments of goods, materials and donations in case of emergency.
10. According to the Ministry of Women and Social Development-PRONAA (National Programme of Food Assistance), the WFP-Ecuador will transfer 100 tons of dehydrated food (biscuits) to Ica.
11. The head of INEI (National Institute of Statistic and Informatics), entity in charge of the census in affected areas, informed that this institution counts with cartographic information of the affected zones updated on April 2007 and additionally, the register of housing per block in these areas. He also indicated that the result of the census will be completed by September 10th.
12. The Ministry of Housing, Construction and Sanitation, indicated that SENCICO (National Service of Training for the Construction Industry) is carrying out the Programme “Aprende Haciendo” (Learn by doing) which inform about the norms and technics to assure anti seismic constructions. After the launch of the Program in Pisco, rural populations in Ica, Chincha and Cañete, as well as other affected zones will receive the training. SENCICO has also the assignment of analyze soil conditions to determine whether is advisable to build in the same areas, reinforce structures or a new location is recommended.
13. The Bank of Materials (government entity that finances affordable housing for people with scarce resources) has transfered to Pisco a team of professionals who are contributing with rubble removal. Additionally it sent a group of machinery in order to collaborate with SEDAPAL (Lima Water Corporation) with pipe’s changing.

Additionally, 130 temporary housing modules have been sent to Pisco (valued in US\$ 180,000).

14. SEDAPAL sent engineers, technicians and operative personnel to emergency zones to distribute water through tankers and assess damages in water and sewage systems. SEDAPAL is also providing technical support to local water enterprises in Ica, Pisco, Chincha, Cañete and Huancavelica.
15. Ministry of Health announced activities focused on prevention of epidemics starting this weekend (mainly education related to hygiene habits and diseases prevention, in particular, diarrheas and respiratory infections).
16. Leaders of traditional fishers unions from San Andrés' creek in Pisco, estimated that there are about 107 boats damaged, 50 destroyed and 2,000 fishers (about 17,000 families) affected as a consequence of tsunami triggered after the earthquake. They indicated that until now they have received 92 net packages and 5,000 life savers.

The UN Response

17. The UN Resident Coordinator in Peru, Jorge Chediak, announced that the UN has approved the release of CERF resources in support of the areas affected by the earthquake. UN Resident Coordinator also said that next Tuesday a meeting of international donors will be held in Geneva to agree on further assistance to Peru. Prime Minister said that 8 days after the earthquake, US\$ 38 million in cash have been given to Peru as international aid in response to the natural phenomenon. He also said that besides the cash, 12,000 tons of in-kind aid has been received as well as a significant number of experts and human resources.

An interagency team is deployed to the affected areas. The report of the interagency team activities on August 23rd is as follows:

UN inter-agency missions assessed the situation in Ica, Chincha and Pisco. A FAO team traveled by land to evaluate the state of irrigation ditches in San Clemente river basin, confirming that the rural areas with priority needs are those between Pisco, Castrovirreyna and Huancavelica.

The total number of UN staff on the field is 32, belonging to the following organizations: PAHO/WHO, UNDSS, UNDP, UNICEF, WFP, USAR, UNDAC, OCHA, UNESCO, World Bank and FAO. In the Pisco area 9 agencies have deployed staff members, while in Ica there is presence of 4 agencies, 1 agency is working in Chincha and a FAO group was scouting yesterday the San Andrés, Tambo de Mora and El Chaco areas. New staff members of UNFPA and the World Bank have traveled to the area today while other UNDP, PAHO, UNDSS, CEPIS, WFP and UNICEF delegates have returned to Lima.

Water and Sanitation

According to FAO observers in *San Andrés, Tambo de Mora* and *El Chaco*, a significant number of post-traumatic stress cases have been reported. Water supply is normal.

Chincha: The UNDP team reports that water supply is regular.

Ica: UN field missions have noticed the lack of water in some villages such as Palpa, while in the regional capital supply is good. Ica's Regional Hospital is lacking sterile surgery material and thus it is not in capacity to perform any surgery.

Pisco: Water supply is assured by tankers, but there is scarcity of latrines and sewage. Waste disposal systems have seemingly collapsed, according to UNDP staff members, and authorities are expected to inform about this subject on August 24th. Health services are deficient in remote areas, where according to PAHO observers, respiratory and renal diseases are appearing.

Food

In *San Andrés, Tambo de Mora* and *El Chaco*, food delivery is well organized although some people still remain by the roads demanding food.

In Chincha, the local market is open to the public and food supply is normal.

In Ica, coordination related to food delivery is improving: 50 dining halls are being implemented. However, the need for more food aid has been identified.

In Pisco, PAHO reports a need for more food aid, even though shelters are well supplied. PRONAA (National Program of Food Assistance) is adequately managing food delivery, although it sometimes duplicates efforts of other institutions.

Infrastructure

In *San Andrés, Tambo de Mora* and *El Chaco*, FAO staff members report that the shelters are nearly at full capacity. The vehicle flow is relatively regular in the area. Rural Institute Valle Grande and the authorities of Yauyos province, in Lima region, told FAO that around 5,000 rural families have been affected in 14 villages of 9 districts. 385 private houses have been damaged as well as 7 churches, 5 schools and another 8 public buildings. In the Laraos district, between 30 and 40% of houses have been damaged.

In Ica UN staff members report that shelters are working normally and their number is enough, but debris has not been removed yet. Access roads to the city are clean.

In Pisco, shelter provision is currently adequate as well as the work of debris removal. However, a lack of storage silos is reported.

Coordination

In Ica, WFP team remarks the good organization and coordination of PRONAA in food distribution, while PAHO staff members report that the Emergency Operations Center of the Ica region is doing a good job.

In Pisco, aid coordination among different organization is gradually improving

Remarks

The FAO mission in *San Andrés, Tambo de Mora* and *El Chaco* has identified the need to rebuild fishing facilities in the second phase.

In Chincha, lack of latrines is a problem

In Ica, PAHO and WFP staff report the following priority needs: water, food and logistic support for aid transport and delivery.

In Pisco, reported needs are food, tents, water, blankets, clothing, latrines and disease control in shelters. Regarding security, UNICEF reports the absence of police in certain neighborhoods.

An Immediate Response Emergency Operation (IR-EMOP) is being implemented by WFP in areas widely affected. By Friday August 24, over 600 tons of food have been delivered to the affected areas, and a convoy sent by the WFP sub-regional emergency hub in Ecuador will arrive on Saturday the 26th with 100tons of High Energy Biscuits. In support of this emergency, WFP also began a procurement process on behalf of the Government of Peru for 3,470 tons of food, and aid is being distributed by WFP government counterpart PRONAA. A WFP wider scale Emergency Operation (EMOP) will require US\$6.1 million.

While about US\$2 million of this will come from the UN Central Emergency Response Fund, WFP will be relying on donors for the remainder.

18. In a meeting held on August 24th by the UN System with bilateral donors and NGO's, the representatives of the countries present in the meeting, indicated their recognition for the role played by the UN System in coordinating the international response and support to the country during the emergency. In that meeting they reiterated their confidence to the RC and requested that the UN continue with the leading role in coordinating the international support.
19. Based on information gathered by UNDSS in the field in consultation with other UN agencies, UNDSS has prepared a chart informing the situation of health institutions in affected areas which shows as follows:

International response

20. On Friday 24th the government of the Principality of Monaco decided to donate 50,000 euros to alleviate the situation of people affected by Peru's earthquake. This donation will be channeled through the Panamerican Health Organization to rebuild health infrastructure in the area.

21. Spanish Secretary of Development Aid said on August 24th that her country will start a Recovery Plan for Peru; earmarking additional funds to those budgeted for Peru in the period 2007-2008. This plan will cover a range of sectors from infrastructure rebuilding to recovery of agriculture and fishing activity. These resources will be channeled through multilateral organizations, NGOs and Spanish debt-relief program. She also said that the emergency phase is almost over and the kind of assistance

needed now is more related to reconstruction. She announced that Spanish emergency personnel would leave Peru next week.

22. German NGO Aktion Deutschland sent 150,000 Euros (more than US\$ 200,000) to Peru, which will be executed by national partners. The aid consists mostly of food, water, blankets, tents and psychosocial support.
23. Oxfam is rolling out a program to help people in rural areas access clean water and begin to rebuild their homes. Oxfam is setting up an office in the city of Pisco in which 12 humanitarian relief specialists will oversee the organization's program in the Humay and Independencia districts of Pisco, provide temporary shelters, blankets and water and sanitation. Oxfam's program will deliver clean water to 2,500 families in Independencia and Humay, as well as one camp for displaced people outside Pisco city. An initial 450 tents, six water storage bladders that will each hold six cubic meters of water, a 45-cubic-meter water tank, and materials to build 1,000 latrines are being flown to Peru by jet from England to start the water and sanitation assistance. These are the first steps of an initial, three-month response for which Oxfam is budgeting US\$1.3 million.
24. The Government of Venezuela will donate food, drinkable water, medicines, blankets, tents and rubble removal equipments.
25. The European Commission has prepared a chart showing the NGO's and areas of intervention as well as type of support they are providing in affected areas. The APCI (Peruvian Agency for International Cooperation) sent updated information on August 24th, that shows as follows:
